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The Adalbert Stifter Gymnasium

In 1974 the Musikgymnasium Linz, a high school for musically gifted students, was founded by Balduin Sulzer as a branch of the Adalbert Stifter Gymnasium, a Catholic private school run by the Diocese of Linz. Our students are either members of the Academy for the Support of Gifted Students at one of the Austrian music universities or students at one of the Austrian music universities in Linz, Vienna, Salzburg or Graz. These institutions offer instrumental and vocal training. Our school provides lessons in musical theory, harmony, music history, analysis and ear training apart from the standard high school curriculum. Students take a final exam that qualifies them for higher education.

Most important are their practical studies in rehearsing for concerts performed way the students experience a wide stylistic range of choral, orchestral and chamber music.
